Because all students are not created equal!



Teachers interview students regarding preferences.

Interview questions will include such things as students favorite things and activities and favorite learning styles.



Establish learning stations that will promote learning styles of every student!

You can decide how many learning stations to set up based on student interview details regarding favorite/best learning styles..



Survey of Student Goals

Similar to step one, but vastly different in the resulting information. You are helping students to see the pathway to what they need/desire to learn throughout the quarter/semester/year.



Allowing students to choose their preferred projects.

Allows students to become actively engaged and excited about the learning process.

Make sure your selections cover the vast majority of students' preferences. Keep it simple, though!



Surprise your students with an outdoor classroom.

You'd be surprised at how much more productive students will be with change of pace. Make it as elaborate or simple as you want and time allows.
